By in-depth knowledge of your area of expertise, ensure data and programs meet the security requirements of the forces, Home Office directives and guidance, and which are compliant with Government legislation, especially with regard to data protection. Ensure system testing is satisfactorily completed to team standards, and timely and proportionate support documentation is produced thereby ensuring a smooth transition from development to operational environment.
- Provide in-depth technical advice and 3rd line support for all applications and web functions that
 have been developed internally by BCH ICT. Using the ICT incident and problem management
 processes assess, investigate, analyse and resolve faults/issues affecting the operational
 delivery of services and functions in line with the departments service level agreements.
 Continually monitor incidents and service requests to ensure alignment with SLAs.
- Contribute to the team culture of agility, responding constructively to changing and emerging requirements. Actively contribute to good levels of team working, morale and productivity both internally within the team and externally within multi-disciplinary project teams, with customers

I identify when I need to take action on the basis of limited information and think about how to mitigate the risks in so doing. I challenge others to ensure that decisions are made in alignment with our mission, values and the Code of Ethics.
