



Role Title:	ERSOU Regional Organised Crime Threat Assessment (ROCTA) Intelligence Analyst
Rank/Grade:	SC6 / SO1
Job Family:	Business Support
Reporting to:	ERSOU ROCTA Senior Analyst
Main purpose of the role:	The post holder will (under general supervision but often operating independently) be responsible for reviewing, analysing, and interpreting intelligence held by the forces in the region and our partner agencies to identify risk, threat, harm and opportunity in relation to serious and organised crime. The post holder will be required to present these findings in written form.  The post holder will perform quality insurance of initial information logs, identification of priority intelligence and following this appropriate dissemination for further research or action.

## **Key Responsibilities**

- Provide analytical support to the identification, assessment and review of OCGs, Individuals and Vulnerabilities through the analysis of sensitive data, Force data bases and partner agency data.
- Develop intelligence collection plans to support the identification of new OCGs, Individuals and vulnerabilities.
- Provide an analytical assessment of the threat from organised crime using all data sources including partner agency data to inform regional tasking and the accurate allocation of resources.
- Accurately assess and create OCGs in line with national guidance.
- Develop a horizon scanning process within the RIU.
- Any other duties/responsibilities commensurate with the post.

## We are emotionally aware

I consider the perspectives of people from a wide range of backgrounds before taking action. I try to anticipate our partners' needs and take action to address these. I do not make assumptions. I check that our partners are getting what they need from the police service. I build commitment from others (including the public) to work together to deliver agreed outcomes.

## We deliver, support and inspire

I give clear directions and have explicit expectations, helping others to understand how their work operates in the wider context. I identify barriers that inhibit performance in my teams and take steps to resolve these thereby enabling others to perform. I lead the public and/or my colleagues, where appropriate, during incidents or through the provision of advice and support. I ensure the efficient use of resources to create the most value and to deliver the right impact within my areas. I keep track of changes in the external environment, anticipating both the short-and long-term implications for the police service. I motivate and inspire others to achieve their best.

## We analyse critically

I ensure that the best available evidence from a wide range of sources is taken into account when making decisions. I think about different perspectives and motivations when reviewing information and how this may influence key points. I ask incisive questions to test out facts and assumptions, questioning and challenging the information provided when necessary. I understand when to balance decisive action with due consideration. I recognise patterns, themes and connections between several and diverse sources of information and best available evidence. I identify when I need to take action on the basis of limited information and think about how to mitigate the risks in so doing. I challenge others to ensure that decisions are made in alignment with our mission, values and the Code of Ethics.

## We are innovative and open-minded





I explore a number of different sources of information and use a variety of tools when faced with a problem and look for good practice that is not always from policing. I am able to spot opportunities or threats which may influence how I go about my job in the future by using knowledge of trends, new thinking about policing and changing demographics in the population. I am flexible in my approach, changing my plans to make sure that I have the best impact. I encourage others to be creative and take appropriate risks. I share my explorations and understanding of the wider internal and external environment.
